

# University Entrance Requirements:

1. Check eINFO!
2. Minimum # of courses needed to apply?
3. Type of courses required? M/U
4. What is the admission Average based on?
5. Pre-requisite courses: ENG4U and .....
6. Pre-requisite courses – Minimum mark!
7. Additional Admission Criteria: audition, portfolio, interview, essay, supplementary application

# Other Considerations

1. Why carry more than 6 grade 12 'U' or 'M' courses?
2. Night School/Online courses/Repeated courses!!
3. All Offers are **CONDITIONAL!!!**
  - Early acceptance is often a marketing ploy
  - These are also based on your Grade 11 marks. Even the most minute drop in marks (less than 1%) can result in conditional offers being rescinded.

# University Application – Next Steps

- Student Services will provide a letter in November that contains:
  - on-line application website
  - school number
  - student number
  - PIN
- The cost to apply is \$150 for 3 choices; \$50 for each additional choice
- Apply On-line by January 17, 2018

# Step 1: Your OUAC Access Codes

You will receive a confidential letter containing your access codes:

- PIN (Personal ID#)
- School Number
- Student Number

**Your PIN is confidential!  
Don't share it with anyone else!**

These numbers will allow you to access your OUAC 101 Online Application.

# Step 2: Research Your University Options

- Read the OUAC 101 Instruction Booklet as well as the 101 Addenda (both available at [www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/](http://www.ouac.on.ca/ouac-101/)) to get the most up-to-date program information.
- Write down your program choices and codes, and keep them handy.

# Step 3: Mark Your Calendar

October/November: Schools distribute Access Code Letters for the OUAC 101 Online Application.

January 17, 2018: Latest date to submit completed online applications to the OUAC.

February 6, 2018: Recommended last day to make changes to your application.

May 29, 2018: Date by which the universities are expected to respond to your application for admission.

June 1, 2018: Earliest date by which the universities may require a response to offers of admission and a financial commitment.

# How many universities and programs can I choose to apply to on my application?

- You may apply to as many Ontario universities/programs as you wish; however, you are limited to a maximum of three program choices at any one university (including affiliates). There are additional costs involved after your first 3 choices.
- Some universities may further limit the number of programs to which you may apply. Make sure that you carefully read the details and instructions offered by each institution. Consult the individual university websites or contact the universities directly for more information.

# Paying for Your Application

You have the following two options:

## 1. VISA / MasterCard / American Express:

- You will need the card number, expiry date, cvv, and the cardholder's name.

## 2. Online / Telephone Banking:

- You will receive an account number from the OUAC as soon as you submit your application.

For best results, this should be done before Christmas. If you wait too long, you may encounter delays.

Please be aware of “next business day” processing. This does not mean tomorrow. Depending on the time of year, bank, etc... they may take 10 days!

Nothing is processed until payment is received.

If you run into errors, call the **Application Inquiries (519-823-1063)** number immediately.

# Application Amendments

In mid-February, the universities begin the early adjudication process and discourage amendments to program choices. **February 6, 2018**, is the recommended last date to submit all information to the OUAC, including university and program changes, as well as additional university/program choices, in order to be eligible for consideration for early admission. This is not a deadline date; changes will be accepted and processed by the OUAC at any time. Some universities may not be able to process late amendments until much later in the admission cycle.

# Out of Province Affiliates

The OUAC assists the following out-of-province institutions in collecting academic data for Ontario secondary school students who have applied through the OUAC:

- The University of British Columbia
- The University of Calgary
- Concordia University

Students who complete an application form for these out-of-province universities can provide authorization for a university to request their academic information from the OUAC. To provide authorization, the applicant must include their 11-digit OUAC Reference Number on the institution's application form. Note: In all cases, the eleventh digit should be "0".

# Royal Military College

## Applying to the Royal Military College of Canada

- The Royal Military College of Canada (RMCC), located in Kingston, Ontario, is not part of the OUAC's processing service. A separate form, along with additional application materials, must be obtained from a Canadian Forces Recruiting Centre. # Is university right for me? What about college?

- Myth: College is an easier alternative to university.
- Fact: They are equally demanding. What makes it different is the smaller learning environment, personalized attention and the blend of theory and practical application.
  
- Myth: College is for students that can't get into university.
- Fact: A good percentage of students in college have already completed university study. College is suitable for students that benefit from an alternate learning style and are looking for the skills to be job ready on day 1. Also, many college programs can be combined with a university degree.

# Is university right for me? What about college?

- Myth: University is the key to getting a job.
- Fact: Maybe 10-15 years ago. Employers now demand staff that have the theoretical knowledge but also the practical skills to be job-ready on day 1. Employers report a 93% satisfaction rate with college graduates, higher than can be said for university graduates.
- Myth: I have to apply to college or university.
- Fact: You can apply to both, in fact we recommend it.

# Other points to remember

- Night school/summer school courses – It is your responsibility to keep us informed. We can't input marks if we don't know about them. Bring us the report card.
- Universities acceptances are based on your final marks semester 1 and mid-term marks semester 2. Check OUAC to ensure that the list of your courses and marks are listed and accurate.
- Check with the universities that you apply to to see if they require supplementary applications. For example, many Nursing programs require applicants to also take the CASPer test to complete their undergrad application.
- Check your email regularly. Universities will send you a lot of information. Read it carefully.
- Print out what you are able to and keep it. **ESPECIALLY YOUR OUAC Reference#** once you pay.
- Listen to announcements or read them in the atrium.
- TOFEL - for students that have come from other countries outside of North America.
- Do your best.
